BYOD

We have witnessed significant changes to Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) programs and use of digital devices in primary schools. Beginning next year, families are not expected to purchase or bring their own iPad to use at school. ISPS will follow the new recommended guidelines provided by the Department of Education, including minimal device time for Prep to Grade 2; and a maximum of 90 minutes per day for Grade 3 to 6.

These changes are intended to support families by reducing cost-of-living pressures. They will also support students by reducing screen-time which can reduce the risk of eye strain, sedentary behaviour, and reduced peer interaction.

Students who already have a device can continue to bring these daily, with the option to leave/store the devices at school overnight.

A New Year of Learning

The Victorian Government has set up a webpage with information and resources for parents and carers to help their children unlock their potential for a new year of learning in 2026. It includes:

- •tips to help with the transition from early childhood education to Prep, primary to secondary school, and Year 10 to VCE
- what to expect at school
- where to find help with school costs and fees
- health and wellbeing guidance to support children's mental health learning and disability supports.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school curriculum items and deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other

Voluntary financial contributions for nonactivities that relate to the students and are above school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
