Congratulations to Maddy Hura who is the recipient of the 2025 Donna Shaw Spirit of Kids+ Award. This award recognises her outstanding voluntary contributions to our community.

With an early diagnosis of cerebral palsy, Maddy's daughter Willow, began attending Kids+ in Geelong, for intensive therapy as part of her early intervention plan, leading to promising progress for which her family is extremely grateful.

This experience inspired Maddy to address the lack of access to intensive therapy in our community. In 2025, Maddy and her team worked tirelessly to raise funds to bring a group of expert paediatric therapists from Kids+ in Geelong to Mildura. Their goal was to provide an intensive therapy program for local babies and children with disabilities, who often struggle to access these vital services. The Kids+ team immersed themselves in the community, working with nine families, while Maddy coordinated everything from morning coffees to accommodation, supported by generous local businesses.

This year one of our LiA projects raised awareness and funds to support Willow's Walkers. We are so proud of Maddy and the Hura family for their unwavering determination to support not only Willow but all children who require therapies and support.

Junior Girls Scholarship Program

Australian Golf Foundation Junior Girls Scholarship program Media Release

The Merbein Golf Club are offering junior girls' golf scholarships in 2026!

The Merbein Golf Club has obtained funding from The Australian Golf Foundation (AGF) to support 18 lucky girls to continue to develop their golfing skills.

Scholarships are open to girls aged 9 to 16 and while the program's primary aim is to retain girls in golf by giving girls a shared golf experience, girls new to golf may also be engaged in this program should they demonstrate a commitment to learning the sport.

"This is a terrific opportunity", said Melinda Binding, Community Golf Instructor, of the Merbein Golf Club. "Not only will girls receive 24 coaching sessions, but also a free one-year junior club membership that carries playing rights, to ensure girls can participate in club competitions and obtain a handicap".

The Scholarship program is part of a national campaign to get more girls playing golf. Along with over 165 other golf facilities across Australia, the Merbein Golf Club will be working closely with golf's national body Golf Australia throughout 2026.

"All we ask is that applicants display a desire and willingness to improve their golf skills, obtain a handicap, play in club competitions (or at least social play) and engage in any extra-curricular activity that fosters friendships between scholarship holders".

A total of 18 scholarships will be available for 2026.

STUDENTS FREE PUBLIC TRANSPORT

From Thursday 1 January 2026, people aged under 18 can travel free on all Victorian public transport services. This includes trams, trains, buses and coach services.

Previously people aged 5 to 18 years could use a child myki card and buy a concession fare.

To access free travel from January, they must use a new Youth myki card and tap the card on and off

each time they travel. For areas that do not use myki cards, they must show their myki card to travel free.

Young people, their parents or guardians can now purchase a Youth myki for \$5 on

transport.vic.gov.au/myki

To buy a Youth myki, customers can create an account or login to an existing myki account, purchase and register the Youth myki, and wait for it to arrive in the mail.

Due to high demand, delivery of the new Youth myki may take longer than the standard 10 business days. Confirmation emails in printed or digital format can be used as a ticket to travel from 1 January, while waiting for a Youth myki to arrive.



VICSWIM

VICSWIM is a 5-day intensive learn to swim and water safety program for children aged 4 to 12 years, run in the summer holidays. VICSWIM is particularly helpful for those who may not access swimming lessons regularly. The Victorian Government subsidises the program, which is run by Aquatics and Recreation Victoria.

Dates: Monday 5 January to Friday 23 January 2026

Time: 5 lessons, 30 minutes each

Location: at 140 venues across the state. To find your nearest location, refer to <u>VICSWIM 2026</u> <u>venues</u> In our region, programs are run at Irymple Pool, Mildura Waves, Red Cliffs Pool and Merbein Pool.

Cost: \$43 per child for the week.
